Beginning in April, the CHI will be available as an interactive electronic document that will allow readers easier access to our guidelines and resources. **In order to continue receiving the CHI without interruption, all readers, including those who now receive it by e-mail, will have to subscribe through our new registration system ([click here](#)).** Print subscriptions will be continued for a limited time for practicing physicians who specifically request paper copies when they register.

Recent issues have addressed HIV, diabetes, hepatitis C, and alcohol treatment. Upcoming topics include hepatitis B, sexually transmitted infections, and osteoarthritis.
